## Curricular Areas

### Literacy

- Listening and Talking:** Pupils will have opportunity to talk and listen in partners, trios and small groups.
- Phonics/Spelling:** Pupils will further develop their understanding of spelling rules and patterns. They will build on their existing phonics knowledge and meet blends and digraphs.
- Reading:** Daily reading sessions will develop pupils reading accuracy, fluency and expression. Comprehension tasks and word and sentence level work will improve the pupils understanding of texts and use of language.
- Handwriting:** Pupils will begin to develop joined handwriting through weekly handwriting sessions and handwriting homework. Pupils will be encouraged to use joined handwriting as much as possible.
- Big Writing:** Pupils will focus on imaginative story writing this term. Pupils will create characters and describe scenes. Weekly grammar sessions will focus on different types of punctuation.

### Maths & Numeracy

- Number, money & measure:** Pupils will consolidate and improve their recall of basic addition and subtraction facts. Pupils will use different mental maths strategies to add and subtract numbers to 100. Pupils will continue to develop their understanding of multiplication and division. Pupils will total amounts to £1 / £5 and will calculate change.
- Time:** Pupils will tell the time on analogue and digital clocks. Some pupils will tell the time at quarter past & quarter to.
- Shape, position & movement:** Pupils will consolidate their knowledge of 2D shapes. Pupils will study 3D shapes and investigate the number of faces, vertices and edges.

**Health & Wellbeing:** This term pupils will be considering what is meant by 'Friendship' and developing social skills

**Modern Languages:** Pupils will learn very basic conversational French.

**PE skills:** Pupils will develop their use of movement and co-ordination through dance.
