Curricular Areas

Literacy

Listening and Talking: Pupils will have opportunity to talk and listen in partnerships, trios and groups in activities across the curriculum.

Phonics/Spelling: Pupils will have weekly spelling sessions focusing on a specific spelling pattern or rule. Weekly grammar sessions will reinforce and enhance pupils understanding of punctuation and sentence building.

Reading: Pupils will start the term reading a poem and complete relevant daily reading tasks associated with their reading (with a link to drama). Pupils will also read a novel and complete relevant daily reading tasks associated with their reading. The tasks will include reading for fluency, comprehension, word and sentence level work and text analysis and evaluation and critical thinking. Pupils will also complete reading for information tasks on a weekly basis.

Handwriting: Pupils will practise both their general handwriting and joint handwriting.

Big Writing: pupils will complete personal, imaginative and functional writing for a variety of purposes. The focus for this term will be instructional, informative and report writing. Pupils will be encouraged to take part in self and peer assessment, and through these activities will come to better understand what makes a good piece of writing.

Maths & Numeracy

Number, money & measure: Pupils will improve their knowledge of basic facts as well as developing their use of strategies for addition and subtraction processes. Pupils will be consolidating their knowledge of multiplication and division with an extension on long multiplication and chunking (long division) methods. Pupil will also study money, budgeting and currency exchange which will be linked with their topic.

Information Handling: Children will be developing their skills in gathering and handling information using spreadsheets and graphs. (technologies link)

Health & Wellbeing: During this term children will focus on healthy living (food health and personal hygiene).

Modern Languages: During French the pupils will focus on food and drink and animals.

ICT skills: During this term pupils will focus on data handling and spreadsheets (links with maths).

PE skills: In this term the pupils will actively participate in gymnastics and dancing.
